Lake Superior Reef Restoration?

Did you know that there are important fresh water reefs in the Great Lakes? Although the fresh water shark is an urban legend, fresh water reefs do exist and many are important breeding habitats for fish. Buffalo Reef, a massive 2200 acre reef in Lake Superior that supports the spawning of both Whitefish and Lake Trout populations is under attack. The reef is currently threatened by being covered from drifting Stamp Sands - a waste material produced in the copper ore mining process that was common in the early 1900's. II Mostro Sets Mack Record!



The course record for the Chicago to Mackinac race was set this fall by Peter Thorton's II Mostro. They didn't set the record during the race, but instead, waited for ideal downwind conditions to attempt a record. The wind cooperated with 30+ knot winds helping propel the boat to a finish of 18:00:23, almost exactly 3 ½ hours faster than the monohull record and 50 minutes faster than the multihull record. For most of the year, Il Mostro stores and preps here at Eldean Shipyard, then heads out for the races. This monohull course record beat the monohull record set by Roy Disney's Pyewacket in 2002. If you have been around our marina for a while, you may remember seeing Pyewacket when it was delivered and launched here 15 years ago when they set this course record for the race.

8 Telltale Signs that the Used Boat You're Buying Could be a Storm-Damaged Lemon!

From Boat US, December 6, 2017: While many of the more than 63,000 boats damaged as a result of 2017 hurricanes will be repaired and have more years of life on the water, some used boat buyers in 2018 could end up with storm-damaged lemons. The nation's largest advocacy, services and safety group for recreational boaters, Boat Owners Association of The United States (BoatUS), cautions used boat buyers that some boats affected by Hurricanes Harvey and Irma are beginning to hit the market, and that getting a prepurchase survey (called a Condition and Value survey) is very important.

"It's not that you don't want to buy a boat that's been repaired, but you should have full knowledge of the repairs and know they were done correctly. It's a transparency issue that will help you negotiate a fair price," said BoatUS Consumer Affairs Director Charles Fort. The boating group offers eight tips to help you spot a boat that might have been badly damaged in a storm:

Trace the history. When a car is totaled, the title is branded as salvaged or rebuilt, and buyers know up front that there was major damage at some point in the car's history. But only a few states brand salvaged boats – Florida and Texas do not – and some states don't require titles for boats. Anyone wishing to obscure a boat's history need only cross state lines to avoid detection, which can be a tipoff. Look for recent gaps in the boat's ownership, which may mean that it was at an auction or in a repair yard for a long time.

Look for recent hull repairs. Especially on older boats, matching gelcoat is very difficult. Mismatched colors around a repaired area are often a giveaway and may signal nothing more than filler under the gelcoat, rather than a proper fiberglass repair.

Look for new repairs or sealant at the hullto-deck joint. Boats that bang against a dock during a storm often suffer damage there. **Evidence of sinking.** Check for consistent corrosion on interior hardware, such as rust on all hinges and drawer pulls. You might be able to spot an interior waterline inside a locker or an area hidden behind an interior structure.

Corrosion in the electrical system. Corrosion on electrical items, such as lamps, connectors and behind breaker panels might mean the boat sank recently. Does the boat have all new electronics? Why?

Look for evidence of major interior repairs. Fresh paint or gelcoat work on the inside of the hull and engine room is usually obvious. All new cushions and curtains may be a tipoff, too. Look for fresh paint on the engine. It may be covering exterior rust as well as interior damage.

Ask the seller. In some states, a seller isn't required to disclose if a boat was badly damaged unless you ask. If the seller hems and haws, keep looking.

Boating Safety...

Kidde Fire Extinguisher Recall! More than 40 million Kidde fire extinguishers equipped with plastic handles, have been recalled. According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), "The fire extinguishers can become clogged or require excessive force to discharge and can fail to activate during a fire emergency. In addition, the nozzle can detach with enough force to pose an impact hazard." The BoatUS Foundation for Boating Safety and Clean water is urging recreational boat owners their boats for the check recalled extinguishers and get a free metal-handled replacement by going to the CPSC recall website.

The recall affects both plastic-handle and push-button Pindicator Kidde fire extinguishers, including 134, ABC- or BC-rated models manufactured between January 1, 1973, and August 15, 2017. The extinguishers are red, white or silver and were sold in the US and Canada through a wide range of retailers. The CPSC recall website shows how to easily identify the affected extinguishers.

In the recall, Kidde also acknowledged the free replacement push-button extinguisher being sent to personal watercraft owners is similar in size to the recalled model but may not fit in the same location as the old fire extinguisher. "This may require a slightly different mounting orientation or location," said BoatUS Foundation Assistant Director of Boating Safety Ted Sensenbrenner."

CPSC says there have been approximately 391 reports of failed or limited activation or nozzle detachment, including one fatality; approximately 16 injuries, including smoke inhalation and minor burns; and approximately 91 reports of property damage.

Winter Storage & Repair...

- 1. Inspect the Sea-Water pump impellers. A minimum of an inspection should be done every 100 hours.
- 2. Load test batteries.
- 3. Service Outdrives/Transmissions.
