

Voluntary Coast Guard Inspections

This year, the Coast Guard Auxiliary has decided NOT



to schedule a day of boat safety inspections at each marina. However, our own boaters, Brian and Carol Rock are in the Coast Card Auxiliary and they are offering to do safety inspections for any of our slip members. Please call or text Carol at

616-994-2508 to schedule an inspection. After passing an inspection, you will receive a 2018 "Safety Check Decal" for your boat. Having the sticker is important as there is a law (as of Feb. 2012) which clarifies conditions under which a peace officer may stop and inspect a vessel: Boaters who have a "Safety Check Decal" displayed on their boat, will be free from random stops by marine patrol boats.

Shark Carp Tank!

It's like the hit TV show "Shark Tank", but is literally for fish, not just a catchy name. In this version (it is actually called the Great Lakes Invasive Carp Challenge) the State of Michigan ran a nationwide contest to help stop the spread of Asian Carp into our Great Lakes. What a great idea! Winning the \$200,000 Grand Prize was awarded to Edem Tsikata for his "Cavitation Barrier to Deter Asian Carp", which uses "specially designed propellers to generate a wall of cavitation bubbles that implode and emit high-speed jets of water" which the carp will avoid because the bubbles are painful and the propellers are noisy. 2nd place and \$125,000 was won by David Hamilton, a fellow Michigander who designed a chlorinated system to use in the lock chambers that will kill the Carp. In 3rd place and receiving \$100,000 was Michael Scurlock. Scurlock created a physical velocity barrier that creates a fast water flow around vessels while moored in a lock, essentially flushing the Carp out the back of the lock. Lastly, Dr. Lee was awarded \$75,000 and 4th place for his system that directs "all fish through an automated imaging and sorting system that uses unique recognition software to divert invasive carp to a holding area for harvest." While the US Federal Government has seemed to drag their feet on finding a solution to stop the invasion into the Great Lakes, Canada's Federal Government has committed \$20M over the next five years. Waterfront Film Fest's New Venue!

Come check out Waterfront Film Festival's new permanent venue at the OPEN HOUSE June 7 from 5:30-7:30pm.

The new facility, on Columbia Avenue near downtown Holland, features a versatile space that can be used as a 125-seat theater or as an event space. The building, a renovated auto-body shop, also serves as WFF headquarters and offices. Waterfront organizers spent much of the past two years revamping the industrial site into a multi-purpose studio with large garage doors that roll up to create a unique indoor/outdoor gathering space. Plans for phase II of the project include an update to the building façade, and landscaping for an outdoor seating and reception area.

The redesign was made possible by a matching grant awarded by the Michigan Council for Arts & Cultural Affairs. The non-profit organization restructured its operations, transitioning from an annual 4- day festival toward individual screenings at the new permanent facility capable of offering year round events. The space will also be available for rental for corporate events, weddings and other gatherings.

PLASTICS EATER!

From Soundings Trade Only 4/19/18: "Scientists have accidentally created a mutant enzyme that eats plastic bottles! It's very promising. The breakthrough, as reported in the British publication, *The Guardian*, emanates from discovery of plastic-eating bugs in a Japanese dump. It could help solve the global plastic pollution crisis in our waterways and in fish that we may consume.

The mutant enzyme takes a few days to start breaking down the plastic but far faster than the centuries it takes in the oceans! Moreover, the researchers are optimistic it can be sped up and become a viable large-scale process. FYI - one million plastic bottles are sold each minute around the globe with just 14 percent currently recycled. Countless ends up in waterways harming marine life and, potentially, people who eat seafood. Kudos to Prof John McGeehan, at the University of Portsmouth, UK, who leads the research."

Spring is a good time to check your safety gear. Be sure pay special attention to your fire extinguishers. If you have Kidde fire extinguishers with plastic handles they may be subject to a recent product recall. The extinguisher can become clogged or require excessive force to discharge and can fail to activate during a fire emergency. In addition, the nozzle can detach with enough force to pose an impact hazard. Kidde will replace the units. You can call Kidde at 855-271-0773 or online at www.kidde.com and click "product safety recall."

It is also a good time to inspect your flares and life jackets. One other area that is often over looked is the condition of your dock lines. Make sure they are still serviceable and of the proper size.

Impossible to Capsize?



From Popular Mechanic: The Thunder Child is a high speed, wave-piercing boat that's built to be uncapsizable. The boat was designed by Safehaven Marine for use by Navy, law enforcement, and other groups who sail in high-pressure situations. The boat can fit 10 crew members on board. It's built to absorb shocks from rough seas.

But by far the most impressive thing about the Thunder Child is its ability to right itself even if it is completely capsized. There are a few factors that allow this boat to sail through any conditions without permanently capsizing. First, it has a very low center of gravity. Second, the cabin itself is watertight, so if the boat does flip over, water won't rush in. And lastly, the cabin is built to be extremely buoyant, so if the boat does end up upside down, it will naturally right itself. In this video, a crane pulls the boat 180 degrees and allows it to self-right. This is pretty exciting to watch along with the people inside the boat--you can't help but hold your breath and hope it really does what it's supposed to do. It does right itself, easily!

The Fish are Back!

If you recall, last year we did not receive any salmon to feed and stock. This year we received 38,000! The DNR studies suggested that the Alewife population was down so the DNR was hesitant to plant too many salmon if there were not enough Alewives to feed on. It sounds like the DNR will be alternating the locations and varying the quantities of salmon planted throughout Lake Michigan until the baitfish population has rebounded. The totals from the DNR's 2017 fall fish-stocking efforts icluded: The DNR stocked nine different species totaling 834,175 fish that weighed nearly 11.5 tons and Fish were stocked at 76 locations throughout the state. "It was another outstanding fall fish-stocking season that will enhanced opportunities throughout provide Michigan," said Ed Eisch, DNR fish production manager. "When added to our successful spring and summer stocking efforts, that brings the total for 2017 to more than 26.4 million fish put into Michigan's waters."

Planting of adult fish makes for great fishing in Southeast Michigan. The DNR reported: More than 4,000 adult trout – fish that had been used for breeding at our state hatcheries – recently were stocked in the Clinton River (Auburn Hills, Rochester Hills), the Huron River (Proud Lake Recreation Area) and the Spring Mill Pond (Island Lake Recreation Area), making southeast Michigan a great destination for spring fishing. The Clinton River was stocked with 800 rainbow trout and 650 brown trout, all upstream of Yates Dam; the Huron River took 1,600 brown trout and 1,200 rainbow trout, all ranging in size from 11 to 22 inches; 400 brown trout and 400 brown trout between 14 and 22 inches now call the Spring Mill Pond home.

Before you hit the water to target these trout, remember that special regulations apply. The Huron River at Proud Lake Recreation Area is limited to flies only, catch-and-release fishing and Spring Mill Pond at Island Lake Recreation Area is limited to artificial lures only, catch-and-release fishing, both from April 1 through April 27. Starting April 28, all baits are allowed on both waters and anglers may keep up to five trout over 8 inches, but just three that measure over 15 inches.
