Pick up your Keys

Pool and Head Keys are each available in the Shipstore. Each key has a \$20 deposit that is refunded when you return the key.

Parking Stickers

If you haven't already, please fill out your parking form and we will mail you up to 3 parking stickers (\$20 each). This is the new orange oval sticker. If you purchase a new car, *just bring us your old sticker* and we will issue a new one at no charge. The parking stickers are usually updated every 5 years, so you do not need new stickers every year. Day/weekend passes will be available for your guests at no charge. On busy days, guests parking will be directed to building #7.

Your Boat Keys, please: We need to have a spare set of your keys and/or combination to your boat in order to move the boat in the event of an emergency.

Pool Rules – 5 People MAX in your group and the boat owner/family member must be present (Do not give your keys to neighbors or friends). Click here for More of the Pool Use Policy.

If you leave with your boat for 48 hours -

When you are not using your slip we make it available for transient boaters to rent on a nightly basis. If you go cruising or remove your boat from the slip for any reason for 48 hours or more, *you are required* to let us know that you will be vacating the slip. Climate Change: Warming & Cooling Water

Most of us are aware of Climate Change and are concerned over the prospect of warmer oceans and raising ocean water levels, among others. But did you know that some parts of the ocean are still cooling from a previous climate change known as the Little Ice Age? The Little Ice Age occurred between 1300 and 1870 AD and temperatures in the Northern Hemisphere averaged a decrease of 1.1 degrees during this time. An article in Popular Mechanics explained "That cooling affected the water on the surface of the Pacific Ocean. That surface water doesn't stick around on the surface forever, though, and eventually it started sinking to the bottom. The Pacific Ocean is so big that it can take a long time for that colder water to sink, hundreds or even thousands of years. A group of researchers from Harvard have found the cold water from the Little Ice Age in a deep underwater zone of the Pacific, where it's still sinking and cooling everything around it." DNR Outdoorsy Classes...

Did you know that the DNR offers many classes to help you enjoy the outdoors and our great parks, lakes, and streams? They call it the Outdoor Skills Academy and there are many classes that revolve around fishing & hunting, but there are others like *Wildflower Photography* and *Attracting Butterflies with Native Plants*. The MDNR states, "We offer expert instruction, gear and hands-on learning for a range of outdoor activities, from hunting and fishing to hiking, birding and much more.

Classes explore each topic in-depth, for a full day or more, with knowledgeable and skilled instructors leading the way. Participants will receive a certificate of completion for each class, with special recognition for Outdoor Skills Academy "graduates" who complete multiple classes. Both beginners and those with more experience are welcome. Most of these in-depth classes are designed for adults, youth ages 16 and older, and children over 10 who are accompanied by an adult." Free Boating Safety Classes!

From the MDEQ: In Michigan, boaters born after June 30, 1996, must have a boating safety certificate to operate a boat, and boaters born after Dec. 31, 1978, need a boating safety certificate to operate a personal watercraft. "If you're on the water operating a boat, or even a canoe or kayak, it's your responsibility to do so safely," said Lt. Tom Wanless, DNR Law Enforcement Division. "We strongly encourage new boaters to take a boater safety course, so they are aware of the do's and don'ts of the water. Even if you have been on the water for years, it's important to refresh yourself on the latest regulations." The DNR offers boating safety education as a self-paced, online course and as a traditional classroom experience. Learn more or register for a class at the DNR boating safety certificate webpage. Plan Ahead for Cruising...

We already have a waiting list of transient boaters and we need your cooperation in order to provide them dockage. Hermann and his family also own the El Rancho restaurants in Holland. The Big Red Stop is located across the street from the marina at the




corner of 32nd and South Shore Drive.

More from DNR – New Rules:

Love to boat or fish? You'll want to make note of some recent changes in Michigan's Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act geared toward preventing the spread of invasive species and supporting natural resources stewardship efforts for the future.

Before leaving and before launching...

inspect everything!



In addition to the existing law requiring all aquatic plants be removed from boats and trailers before launching, the changes require the following, prior to transporting any watercraft over land:

- Remove all drain plugs from bilges, ballast tanks and live wells.
- Drain all water from any live wells and bilges.
- Ensure the watercraft, trailer and any conveyance (vehicle) used to transport the watercraft or trailer are free of aquatic organisms, including plants.

This means that after hauling out trailered boats and before getting on the road, boaters must pull plugs, drain water and remove plants and debris from all watercraft, trailers and other conveyances. <u>View new rules</u>.

WATER LEVEL UNCERTAINTY...

According to the most recent update, the lake level this summer should be a few inches higher than last season. However, the USACE gives a wide range in their estimation and it could mean the water drops a little or goes up a foot! With that in mind, we may raise a few more of the lowest docks in order to keep all of our feet dry. These water level projections change monthly, but we would certainly be happy to see the water not rise any further and leave the docks where they are!

Mail-in-the-Pail...

Beautiful New Center Consoles!

Viking Yachts have been well known and well built boats for many years, primarily in the sport fish and yacht markets. Viking Yachts recently announced the creation of a new boat building company: Valhalla Boatworks. Vahalla Boatworks will focus on the luxury center council market. Designs already include a 33', 37' and 41' models with dual, triple and quad outboards respectively.



"This is a culmination of all of our years of yacht building and helping our customers fill a need for a Viking center console," said CEO Pat Healey in an address to dealers and owners. "These boats are going to be [both] custom and production. We can match [our] big boats to small boats that will all look the same."

Hydrofoiling Powerboat by Beneteau!

Many of us have seen the how foiling sailboats have taken over the Americas Cup and have marveled at their technology and performance.



Now, Group Beneteau is bringing the technology to powerboats. According to Beneteau, "the result is truly outstanding: groundbreaking sensations on the water with and without the foils, improved boat performance, better comfort on board while foiling, reduced fuel consumption...This concept boat perfectly sums up the Group's approach to innovation, with a unique and pioneering project."

GM Enters the Pontoon Market!

General Motors is bringing their electric and battery technologies to the water with their introduction of the "Forward First Marine" division. Their prototype is a 24' pontoon, capable of 20 mph and a maximum run time of 10 hours at 5 mph. This sounds like a great new design to me. Do you think that GM is trying to get in the boat manufacturing market or maybe just developing an electric power system that could be sold to manufactures? In any case, it will be interesting to see how it evolves!

Evinrude Helps with Tech Shortage!

As you may know from reading in a previous newsletter or from experiencing firsthand when requesting boat work, there is a shortage of marine technicians in the Boaters, businesses, and even the United States. government are all attempting to solve this problem. One recent example of a couple of marine stakeholders putting a plan into action is Evinrude motors, the National Marine Distributors Association (NMDA) and the American Boat and Yacht Council (ABYC). According to the Association of Marine Industries, "Evinrude will donate two million dollars' worth of Evinrude ETEC G2 3.4L V6 outboard engines to ABYC Foundation to support the next generation of marine technician training. The donation, which is the largest of its kind in history, will support students in high schools and colleges across the U.S. and Canada. The NMDA will provide matching funds to assist schools, as needed, with costs associated with purchasing test tanks, tools and with shipping outboards. Evinrude's donation includes access to the entire Evinrude training curriculum, fundamentals and professional level online courses".

Sooner or later all boaters will probably need a marine survey whether it's a pre-purchase survey or an insurance survey. A surveyor is someone that evaluates and investigates boats. They survey the structure and machinery of a vessel and make sure that the vessel meets governmental safety requirements.

It is very important that the surveyor you select is a member of one of the national certified organizations. Some of these organizations include SAMS (Society of Accredited Marine Surveyors), NAMS (National Association of Marine Surveyors), ABYC (American Boat and Yacht Council) and IIMS (International Institute of Marine Surveyors). In the case of a prepurchase survey it is also advisable to contract with a marina or engine manufacturer to do an engine evaluation. This may involve items like a compression check and oil analysis.

Looks like we should have a great boating season with more people enjoying the water at our great facility than ever before!



We've come a Long Way!

This is a 1950's era photo of Jeieks Bros. Marina – Herb and Roger Eldean purchased the marina in 1973

There are a lot of interesting and notable boats and marina history in this photo:

- Well, obviously, there is an Airplane moored to a Buoy!
- -Check out the 80' YP powerboat at our 40' Mast Dock!
- You can see the pilings for what will become D-dock (originally D-dock was called the "Dog Leg" dock, as it turned off the base of C-dock).
- -Look at all those wooded boathouses over the water!
- -The entire side of old Building #1 is a door and is open. That way they could slide out a 70' boat sideways and onto the rail system for easy launching straight ahead.
 - Most of the boats are power boats, even on the buoys.
